### Welcome to our Sunday Services

A warm welcome to everyone joining us at St Mary Magdalen this week, especially if you are here for the first time or visiting. Our worship follows the printed order of service and the readings and hymns are on an additional sheet. Large print versions are available from the sidespersons (the welcomers at the door). If you are using a hearing aid, please switch it to the T position so as to make best use of the hearing loop system. It is traditional to stand for the hymns and some of the prayers and readings, but if this is difficult for you then please do remain seated and comfortable.

In the entrance area are toilets, and there is a crèche area at the back of the church. During the service there are activities in the entrance area for children of all ages, at Sunday Club.

As part of each service we share Communion together and everyone is invited to come forwards to receive bread and wine as we remember the sacrifice of Jesus Christ. If you would prefer to come for a blessing then simply carry the service booklet with you. At 10.00am, non-alcoholic communion wine is available on request in the Lady Chapel (to the left) and gluten free wafers on request at the main Communion rail.

Please talk to the sidespersons if you have any other questions and do please stay after the service for tea or coffee and introduce yourself to some of us.

'What if'...' session when Nita Devadhai will discuss what to do when problems arise.



### St Mary Magdalen Church Knighton



18th August 2017

Dear Friends from the Friday Eucharist,

I write to tell you that the Church Wardens and I met recently to discuss the pattern of midweek services across the two parishes of the benefice, and we have reluctantly come to the conclusion that it is now too difficult for our clergy to support three services each week, one at St Guthlac's on a Thursday morning and the two at St Mary's on Tuesday and Friday. With regret we have decided that we need to try a new pattern of services that does not include a Friday Eucharist most weeks. **Friday** 1st September will therefore be the last ordinary Friday Eucharist.

I know that this will be a profound disappointment to you but I hope that you will understand we have not reached this conclusion lightly, and that you may be able to come to one of the other midweek services instead if this suits you.

The Wardens and I were also in agreement, however, that the monthly healing and requiem services should be continued in a combined form, including the Eucharist, on the last Friday of each month. The first of these new Services for Healing will be on **Friday 29**th **September at 11am**, and I hope that you will be able to come. We will be publicising the service more widely too, since others may well find it helpful.

We will take the opportunity of the last ordinary service on 1<sup>st</sup> September to give thanks for all that God has done across the years through this regular time of worship. In the meantime please do talk to me more about this change if you would find it helpful.
