"It's good to be back.....I'm off again now"

It is really good to be back in the parish after a wonderful holiday in Iceland followed by the Diocesan Conference at Swanwick. However, on Oct 1st I'm off again, starting my placement at Peterborough Cathedral, which will be full time for aprox 5 weeks. Leicester Diocese requires that all curates undertake a placement during their 3rd year (yes, it's almost unbelievable that this is my 3rd year at St Mary's). The placement should be in a context that is different from any of my previous experience, so I have agreed with Adrian and the diocese that this will be a great opportunity for me. I am also deeply grateful to the Diocese of Peterborough for making this possible and particularly to The Revd Canon Tim Alban Jones. Acting Precentor, Acting Dean and Chaplain to the Bishop of Peterborough, who will be my supervisor.

During my time in Peterborough I will be involved in many aspects of cathedral life, leading worship, working on the various teams (vergers, welcoming, cathedral chaplaincy) as well as various staff and management team and meetings. It is also hoped that I will have some involvement with the city church of St John the Baptist in the cathedral square. This church works closely with the cathedral and is involved in social action within the city.

Directly after this placement I have an IME training day followed by a short retreat at Walsingham before re-joining St Mary's on Sat 11th Nov. In His service, Neil

HERITAGE LOTTERY FUND (HLF) BID FOR STEEPLE REPAIRS

As you may know, the Buildings Group submitted a bid to the HLF (East Midlands) under the 'Grants for Places of Worship' programme in May of this year in respect of repairs to the church steeple estimated to cost in the region of £186,000. We heard on Thursday last week that sadly our bid was **unsuccessful**. The current national programme is ending shortly and the HLF Committee had to take decisions on more projects than the available budget would allow. Since our application was not as urgent compared to other applications that had been received our bid was rejected due to insufficient funds. However, the HLF noted in their letter that 'there was clearly work that would be grant-eligible' under the HLF's 'Our Heritage' programme and that if we wished to submit a project enquiry they would be willing to offer comments and feedback. This course of action will be followed up by the Buildings Group.

TRYING OUT DIFFERENT ARRANGEMENTS FOR COFFEE: Recently the PCC decided that we would begin to think about ways in which the space at the back of the church and in the Narthex could be best used, particularly after the 10am service when the flow of people collecting coffee and later leaving needs to be carefully managed. As part of this process we are trialling some different arrangements for coffee and the distribution/collection of service booklets- which will be announced each week in church. Please let PCC members and clergy have your views about the different arrangements, as no doubt not all will work! Many thanks. Adrian

THE RED CROSS IRMA HURRICAN BUCKET COLLECTION:


