The Leicester Lockdown - When will services begin again in church?

In a recent conversation with other local ministers we were all agreeing how difficult it is to plan ahead at the moment. We simply don't know how the pandemic will progress from this point on, and although we are all hoping that the trends keep moving in the right direction we also see the news about significant spikes in infections both in the UK and in other countries. The upshot of this is that I would love to be able to present you with a cast-iron plan for the future weeks and months.... but I can't! All our plans have to be provisional and we have to be ready to change them in the light of events, and also in the light of what we learn about worshipping and meeting together under these difficult circumstances.

What I can give you though is our 'direction of travel' and our intentions as they stand at this point:

- the Parish Centre re-opens for use by the St Mary's Pre-School from 1st September, and for other users (subject to extra precautions and cleaning) from 8th September;
- James. Our Parish Administrator, and Mark and Steph, who take care of the Parish Centre, will return from furlough on 1st September;
- the church building will be open for a service of Morning Prayer on Sunday 6th September, at 10am;
- the church building will be open for a service of Holy Communion on Sunday 13th September, at 10am;
- following his ordination as priest in the Cathedral on Sunday 13th September, Matthew will preside at a service of Holy Communion at St Mary's on Wednesday 16th September at 7.30pm;
- we will celebrate the Eucharist again on Sundays 20th and 27th September, at 10am;
- on Sunday 4th October we will celebrate our Harvest Festival and then have our Annual Church Meeting (postponed from April and looking back at 2019).

There is much still to be organised ahead of our services, and it is clear for example, that because of the need for social distancing we will not be able to accommodate the number of people who typically came to a morning service before the pandemic. Please do look out for more details about the services in future newsletters.

Meanwhile we will continue to produce our Virtual Worship each week and of course the Newsletter will be emailed or posted out to everyone for whom we have contact details and permission.

Listening to God's Word

Our Bible readings for Sunday, 23rd August are: Isaiah 51.1-6 and **Matthew 16.13-20**

Peter declares that Jesus is the Messiah

¹³ When Jesus came to the region of Caesarea Philippi, he asked his disciples, 'Who do people say the Son of Man is?'

¹⁴ They replied, 'Some say John the Baptist; others say Elijah; and still others, Jeremiah or one of the prophets.'

¹⁵ 'But what about you?' he asked. 'Who do you say I am?'

¹⁶ Simon Peter answered, 'You are the Messiah, the Son of the living God.'

¹⁷ Jesus replied, 'Blessed are you, Simon son of Jonah, for this was not revealed to you by flesh and blood, but by my Father in heaven. ¹⁸ And I tell you that you are Peter, and on this rock I will build my church, and the gates of Hades will not overcome it. ¹⁹ I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven; whatever you bind on earth will be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth will be loosed in heaven.' ²⁰ Then he ordered his disciples not to tell anyone that he was the Messiah.

Reflection: 'Who do you say I am?' *by the Revd Aphro McCullough*

As many of you know mum was Greek and as I grew up I saw her pray every day, in the morning as soon as she got up and at night before she got into bed and I understood that she had faith in God and in Jesus. When I got older I rejected her kind of faith because I thought that the Orthodox way of using icons in worship bordered on idolatry and when I got even older I realised that the icon is a window through which we see God and Jesus and not in itself to be worshipped. I made a long journey of discovery and I'm still on it!

to prove how clever I was, "who is Jesus to you?" she replied "he is my best friend". End of conversation. My mum knew who Jesus was and when she died she did so with a smile on her face because she knew He was waiting for her on the other side.

In our Gospel reading for today Jesus asks the twelve who they think he is. Peter replies instantly "well you're the Messiah of course, the Son of the living God." This was dangerous talk but like the voice at his baptism and on the mount of transfiguration, Jesus confirms that what Peter has said is true. Wow, what a revelation, hard to keep it to yourself but that's exactly what Jesus tells his disciples to do. Don't tell anyone, not yet, it's not time.

For us of course, the opposite is true. The moment we recognise who Jesus is we are to tell everyone about it! Even now, locked down, fed up and miserable we are the church, and we have the hope embodied in Peter's words, "you are the Messiah, the Son of the living God". So, I leave you with the question, who is Jesus to you and who are you going to tell about it today?
