Welcome to Morning Worship on the Third Sunday.

You'll remember that in our consultation called 'Cherishing the Past, Shaping the Present and Planting for Tomorrow' there was a wide recognition across the church that, as well as continuing to enjoy our traditional Eucharistic services, we also need to try new things so as to make coming to worship at St Mary's easier for a wide range of new people.

Today, therefore, we begin something new. For a trial period we are adapting our morning service on the third Sunday of each month from our usual Sung Eucharist to 'Morning Worship'. This is a form of service drawn from the Church of England Prayer Book Common Worship, and is widely used across the country.

In order to help everyone follow Morning Worship without any problems we have put all the liturgy, Bible readings and hymns into one booklet. You'll notice many familiar parts to the service as well as a few new things.

I am confident that the God who calls people everywhere across the world to know him and to worship him, albeit in different languages and forms, will be with us here today. Please take a moment at the start of the service to ask God to speak to us today and to help us praise and worship him in Spirit and in truth. Later, do let me have your comments about Morning Worship. *Adrian*

ABOUT OUR SERVICES

- Our worship follows the printed order of service
- Large print versions are available from the sidespersons (the welcomers at the door). If you are using a hearing aid, please switch it to the T position so as to make best use of the hearing loop system.
- It is traditional to stand for the hymns and some of the prayers and readings, but if this is difficult for you then please do remain seated and comfortable.
- In the entrance area are toilets, and there is a crèche area at the back of the church. As the main 10am service is for all ages, there is no Sunday Club for the children this week.
- As part of the 8.00am service we share Communion together and everyone is invited to come forwards to receive bread and wine as we remember the sacrifice of Jesus Christ. If you would prefer to come for a blessing then simply carry the service booklet with you.

Please talk to the sidespersons if you have any other questions and do please stay after the 10.00 am service for tea or coffee and introduce yourself to some of us.


The office is closed on **Wednesdays**.

In the week leading up to 11th November and the events marking the centenary of the ending of WW1, we are hoping that groups of children from our local schools will visit St Mary's to see our special exhibition and to take part in a workshop on the theme of 'Knighton Remembers'. The workshop will be practical and craft based so that the children will have something to take away with them, but will also help them to learn key points about how the people of Knighton were affected by WW1 and the importance of remembrance.

We are looking for a 'Schools Facilitator' to prepare and deliver this workshop to Primary School groups across the week, acting as a guide to the exhibition and liaising with teachers. This paid role involves a total of 80 hours work before and during Centenary week.
